### Appendices

National identity is a social construct that accumulates a significant number of relevant elements, including national cuisine. Given the rapid growth of integration and migration processes, it is appropriate to monitor the processes and methods of preserving cultural traditions, especially with regard to traditional dishes and methods of their preparation. This issue becomes most relevant when it comes to the Ukrainian diaspora, because it is difficult to preserve traditions and customs due to the influence of assimilation processes. Given the fact that Canada is home to more than 1 million people — natives of Ukraine (and in the US this number reaches almost 1 million people), who already have their own history and genesis of the Ukrainian national cuisine in North America — from a practical point of view, it is interesting to trace these transformational processes, while focusing on the role of food culture in preserving national identity.

My research will be based on the processing of newspapers, magazines, cookbooks and other archival materials. These sources will help in the theoretical part, as well as in understanding the historical context, change and transformation of the national cuisine and identity. I will also take the opportunity to have personal interviews with the owners and chefs of the Ukrainian restaurants in North America. Interviews will help to understand the current state of affairs in the Ukrainian-American food landscape.

I will apply an interdisciplinary approach based on historical, anthropological and cultural theory. I will also borrow some concepts from ethnogastronomy to understand the transformation of the Ukrainian national cuisine in a specific period of time. The social and ethnicity of food will be considered to demonstrate that food can be a marker and/or destroyer of ethnic identity.

The historical method is expected to be used in Chapter 1 and 2 of the doctoral dissertation, in turn, the methods of abstraction, concretization, analysis, synthesis, induction, deduction — in fact throughout the whole work.

The study will be based on a number of results obtained as a result of the application of the statistical method, namely, statistical compilation, statistical grouping and correlation-regression analysis. The advantage of using this method is seen in the visual demonstration of relevant indicators, but in the case of correlation-regression analysis there is a likelihood of significant error (in the absence of reliable sources, in particular, at the stage of information collection and primary processing). In other words, a visual approach will be used here. At the same time, monitoring and analysis of the content of thematic online platforms dedicated to the history of national cuisine and the identity of the Ukrainians in North America will be used.

# Research questions and hypotheses.

The dissertation must prove (answer the following questions):

- 1. How important is national cuisine for a national identity (among the other components)?
- 2. Does Ukrainian cuisine differ in Canada and the United States? If yes, then how?
- 3. How is the gastronomic identity of Ukrainians in North America expressed?

**Hypothesis**. The national gastronomic heritage of the Ukrainian diaspora in North America is an integral part of Ukrainian cuisine, as a result, the expediency of separating the culture of the diaspora from the Ukrainian culture as such will be considered. The gastronomic identity of the Ukrainians in North America must be different, as it was influenced by various external factors.

Relevance of the topic. Along with language, food is the most obvious carrier of national identity. Even in today's globalized world, it is no coincidence that certain dishes are used as a clear symbol of a certain nationality. If dishes such as onion soup, ratatouille or crème brûlée bear a French cultural imprint, borscht or varenyky are one of the national symbols of Ukraine. In the era of the formation of European political nations, the existence of such dishes-symbols significantly contributed to the consolidation in societies of the idea of national identity. The question of the relationship between ethno-national identity and traditional Ukrainian cuisine is sufficiently unexplored. That is why the relevance of the dissertation research is due to the increasing practical and scientific interest in understanding the identity of Ukrainians and its manifestation through the national cuisine, given recent events with attempts by Russia to appropriate specifically Ukrainian dishes. Migration processes also influence the change of approaches to gastronomic preferences. In particular, they are reduced to revealing the role and significance of national traditional dishes as one of the symbols of Ukrainian national identity in the context of ethno-political processes. The scientific novelty of the obtained results follows from the relevance of the topic and the absence of such comparative studies. The practical significance of the work is revealed from the results of empirical research, which provides systematization of recipes and comparison of the menus of Ukrainian restaurants in Ukraine, Canada and the United States, for a general picture of understanding the differences between national cuisine in isolation from the country of origin.
